There has been a very positive and purposeful start to the year. We have welcomed our new Year 7 students and they are currently engaging in our induction programme. The Year 7 Welcome Mass, at which parents attended, was an experience that pupils and many staff will never forget. Engagement from our new family of parents has been superb, all are supportive of our high standards and drive to be the best school we can be. They are also challenging us, which is a great characteristic, as it will allow us to constantly improve what we do as a school and community. After half term we are completing a "big ask" survey of our new Year 7 pupils and parents to establish how their first term at St Bede's unfolded and to see what more we can do to support them. I would encourage all to respond. We will repeat this with other year groups later in the year.

We have already held two evenings with Year 11 pupils and parents. One evening focussed on how parents and pupils can work together at home to ensure the best outcomes for pupils are realised and the other evening was our Year 11 parents' evening. This evening was very well attended with over 87% of parents in attendance. Year 11 have also been treated to a common room for their lunch and breaktime. This has proven very popular and is a calm oasis of both mature chat and work. This is being supervised by our students and they have been grateful of the opportunity to be treated as young adults.

We have started the year clearly setting out our high expectations in relation to uniform, appearance, attitude to learning, attendance and punctuality. This has seen clear changes to pupil attitude and behaviour. The support from parents and carers has been exceptional, with a clear recognition as to our intentions. This has now led to the overall majority of lessons starting on time and in a structured way. We are also seeing a more effective form time approach with pupils on time and instantly engaged in acts such as worship and reading.

Our extra-curricular programme is up and running with choir rehearsals now in full swing, along with lunchtime Art Club, Peace and Justice group, Faith In Action, Games Club and homework club. We also have our environment ambassadors continuing to work on our sensory garden at the rear of school. After school support clubs have started and we have already had many pupils competing in a range of events locally and regionally from football matches and netball matches to cross country running.

We are in the process of creating a parent focus group to help further inform our development planning and to establish a means of presenting new ideas and information to them prior to it becoming school policy and routine. I will be contacting all parents to engage them in this next half term.

The ongoing climate crisis, international conflict ,issues of inequality and the cost of living crisis, have exposed deep rooted and systematic inequalities in our society. The young people of St Bede's recognise the necessity for healing and transformation, they see the need to build a fairer, more equal and sustainable world, so that we may look ahead with hope.

Pope Francis calls us to 'prepare the future', not passively 'prepare for the future.' Our young people, know that if we work together, we can flourish individually and in our communities.

This vision is at the heart of our St Bede's Million Minutes Peace and Justice group

As a group of Year 8, 9 and 10 pupils they plan, coordinate, and deliver a number of activities which involve social action and which are linked to the principles of Catholic social teaching. It is their hope, that through these activities we can help to bring about positive outcomes in our local and global community.

Recognising that there is an abundance of inspiring and effective social action and programmes already happening in our local community one of the first activities they planned was a community mapping event. Speaking with a variety of groups and individuals from the community allowed the pupils to formulate a clear vision of some of the issues which impact negatively on our local and wider area, the support that is already in place and how we could effectively support these programmes through our school's social outreach. The mapping event also enabled the pupils to plan social outreach activities in a cohesive and collaborative way.

The pupils give up their own time to meet each week. Projects last term included an environmental prayer vigil, a Peace and Justice garden and events to raise money for vulnerable families in our community. They raised over £3000. In the last week of term they participated in fundraising for Ukraine, raising over £2000.

This term they are working hard to organise a prayer vigil and fundraise in order to support the work of Aid To The Church In Need, a charity which raises awareness of Christian persecution around the world.

These pupils are inspiring; they are the very embodiment of our mission statement. Through their faith and their actions they are flourishing as individuals bearing fruit, making a difference and in doing so helping to build God's Kingdom whilst also building God's Kingdom earth.

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#RedWednesday Event 23rd November 2022 – Stand up for Faith and Freedom.

As young Christians we at St Bede's Catholic High School, stand in solidarity with persecuted Christians and all who suffer for their peacefully held beliefs. In partnership with Aid to the Church in Need and Christian Solidarity Worldwide, we are organising events in school on the 23rd November in order to raise awareness and shine a light on Christian persecution and also the injustices perpetrated against other faith groups.

St Bede's Breakfast Liturgy Group.

Despite the assumption which some people make, that young people are less interested in faith, a new poll suggests that young people pray more than older generations. The Savanta ComRes survey of 2073 young adults and adults found that young people are more likely to have prayed, attended church and looked at scripture than older generations. Using our faith to help us navigate our way through life and respond to current affairs issues is an incredibly powerful practice for young people and is something which has been embraced by our St Bede's Breakfast Liturgy Group.

This group of year 9, 10 and 11 pupils meet every Tuesday from 8.30am-9.15. Over breakfast, they discuss news events, both national and international and consider how they as young Catholics, might use the Gospels and scripture to help them respond to the news event and then act accordingly. Following their discussion, in addition to daily prayer, a fortnightly collective worship power point is shared with all form classes. Their hope is that it may help young people make sense of and respond to current affairs in a Gospel rooted way.






Laudato Si – Student Leadership LSGLA




















Inspirational work from our Art classes




Year 10 GCSE Photography


