ROBERT'S IDEA AND DESIGN WAS SO SPECIAL THAT IT ACHIEVED SPECIAL RECOGNITION FROM A LEADING SOCIAL HOUSING CONTRACTOR WHO WERE INTERESTED IN USING THE MODEL TO IMPLEMENT IT IN THEIR PROPERTIES!

HOPEFULLY THIS WILL GIVE PUPILS MORE OF A CHOICE, AND IT WILL CUT DOWN ON COSTS FOR FAMILIES TOO.

THIS HAS BEEN A FAST PACED YEAR AND ONCE AGAIN ALL OF THE STAFF AT ST BEDE'S HAVE DELIVERED DAILY TO GIVE THE BEST TO OUR PUPILS. I COULD NOT ASK TO LEAD A MORE DEDICATED GROUP OF PEOPLE. THANK YOU TO EVERYONE!

AFTER A VERY LONG DAY DOWN IN LONDON WE ARE PLEASED TO ANNOUNCE THAT ROBERT O AND HIS TEAM MATE WON THE RASPBERRY PI COMPETITION THEY HAD ENTERED. THIS HAD REQUIRED ROBERT TO DESIGN SOMETHING WITH A BRIEF OF HELPING INDIVIDUALS TO IMPROVE THEIR HEALTH AND WELL-BEING. ROBERT AND HIS TEAM MATE ISAAC DECIDED TO INVENT AN AIR QUALITY CONTROL FLAP THAT COULD SIT INSIDE THE TOP OF YOUR WINDOW AT HOME AND WOULD OPEN OR CLOSE DEPENDING ON THE BETTER AIR QUALITY EITHER INSIDE OR OUTSIDE. HE USED AIR QUALITY SENSORS TO MONITOR INDOOR AIR AND DATA FROM DEFRA WHO MONITOR OUTDOOR TO USE AS A COMPARISON. ANOTHER EXPERT ASKED FOR A PICTURE WITH HIM TO EXEMPLIFY HOW EASILY A MODEL COULD BE CREATED FOR USE IN SOCIAL HOUSING. WATCHING THE BOYS TALK SO EXPERTLY TO AROUND 30 DIFFERENT EXPERTS THAT VISITED OUR STAND THROUGHOUT THE DAY MADE US PROUD.




Year 8 Retreat - Living Authentically





